As we prepare for Baptisms at our 11 o'clock services both this week for Motun and next week for Chloe I have been reminded of the importance of all our baptisms into God's Church. Each time we walk into St Margaret's we are greeted not only by smiling faces but by the font, the start of all our journey's whatever age we are when we are Baptised.

In the set reading from the Old Testament this week we hear that Naaman (after some resistance) "immersed himself seven times in the Jordan...and he was clean." Naaman was healed not only from leprosy but also was converted at the same time. This washing away of his previous life in the Jordan gave him a new life. I wonder if when we pass the font where we baptise and so many hundreds (if not thousands) of people have been baptised over the centuries at St Margaret's, do we remember our own? Do we remember the purpose of baptism and decide again to be renewed in Christ? As we are reminded this week and next of our own baptism waters with rosemary and water from the font, maybe we can decide to look back and make sure this stays with us on our journey now.

Deanery Synod

Alison Gibbs was elected as the new Deanery Lay Chair. As deputy lay chair, Alison worked closely with Gill Jackson and takes on this role following her election on Wednesday evening. We keep her in our prayers. The Deanery Synod meeting was attended by Archdeacon Sam and the meeting spent time looking back at the last six years of the Inspiring Ipswich Project and considered what, as a deanery, we would like to retain from the project into the future. With the Archdeaconry of Ipswich being only one deanery, Archdeacon Sam is reflecting on the possibility of taking other deaneries under her wing - thus broadening and diversifying Ipswich Archdeaconry.

From 'Priest-in-Charge' to Vicar

The PCC and the Patrons (Simeons Trustees) have agreed with the Bishop and Archdeacon's proposal that the 'suspension' of the Benefice of St Margaret's Ipswich, be lifted. This is church legal terminology which means that I can be permanently licensed as Vicar of St Margaret's Church. This will take place during a single, 10am service on the morning of Advent Sunday. Archdeacon Sam will be joining us and I hope that we can begin the new Church year with a great celebration and re-commitment to being God's church in this place at this time.

The life and mission of St Margaret's is financially sustained through generous giving. If you have been giving regularly as part of your practice of gratefully living in God's service, thank you. If you're new to the community, or would like to think about celebrating life in this way, you may find the following helpful: we receive no income from 'The Church'... we are the church! So, thank you – for anything and everything that you are able to give in response to God's generosity.

In church you can give in a couple of ways on the day:

- Collection plate during services a collection plate is sometimes passed among the congregation, but you will more often find it at the South door as you leave or arrive. Do use a yellow envelope if you're a tax payer so gift aid may be re-claimed.
- Tap giving during services a tap giving machine is located on the pillar on the west wall, to the left of the bell tower do consider tapping your card or device. As well as giving regularly, this is also a good way of offering an occasional additional gift.
- **Regular Giving** St Margaret's is registered with the <u>Parish Giving Scheme</u>, allowing you to be in control of your giving and to give securely and safely online by Direct Debit.
- **Online giving** If you wish to make a one-off or extra gift online, you can do so securely via the <u>Parish Giving Scheme</u>.
- **Gift Aid** if you are a tax payer, St Margaret's can claim back the basic tax you have already paid to the government. To make the appropriate declarations, please speak with the treasurer, <u>John Grierson</u>.

• Leaving a **gift in your will** or making a **donation in memory** of a loved one – no matter how large or small, every gift makes a difference. If you would like to talk about this with someone, in confidence, then please consider speaking with the treasurer, <u>John Grierson</u> or the Vicar, <u>Sarah</u>.
