The church is open daily from 10am to 3pm



The Wedding at Cana

This weekend's gospel reading is another epiphany moment. Like so many epiphany moments, this one too came unexpectedly. As we read the story we see that to Jesus, this was perhaps an unwelcome moment in which he found himself caught up in circumstances beyond his control, in a time and place he might preferred to have avoided.

How does this resonate in our lives? Very often life takes an unexpected turn and we too, find ourselves in circumstances not of our own making or choosing. And yet that's the reality of the situation. In those moments, how might we respond?

The Wedding at Cana teaches us many things, one of which might be that Jesus chose, even in unwelcome circumstances, to reveal something of God to the

world. Perhaps that is something we might hope for and pray about? That whatever circumstances we find ourselves in we can ask ourselves what actions or words or response do we offer, in this moment, that will point others to God?

Jesus did this by turning water into wine that the feast may continue. How will your faith this week be shared with others?

Awakenings Concert



Financial Giving

The life and mission of St Margaret's is financially sustained through generous giving. If you have been giving regularly as part of your practice of gratefully living in God's service, thank you. If you're new to the community, or would like to think about celebrating life in this way, you may find the following helpful: we receive no income from 'The Church'... we are the church! So, thank you – for anything and everything that you are able to give in response to God's generosity.

Here are some answers to the practicalities of giving:

- Collection plate during services a collection plate is sometimes passed among the congregation, but you will more often find it at the South door as you leave or arrive.
- **Tap giving** during services a tap giving machine is located on the pillar on the west wall, to the left of the bell tower do consider tapping your card or device. As well as giving regularly, this is also a good way of offering an occasional additional gift.
- Regular Giving St Margaret's is registered with the <u>Parish Giving Scheme</u>, allowing you to be in control of your giving and to give securely and safely online by Direct Debit.
- Online giving If you wish to make a one-off or extra gift online, you can do so securely via the <u>Parish Giving Scheme</u>.

- **Gift Aid** if you are a tax payer, St Margaret's can claim back the basic tax you have already paid to the government. To make the appropriate declarations, please speak with the treasurer, <u>John Grierson</u>.
- Leaving a **gift in your will** or making a **donation in memory** of a loved one no matter how large or small, every gift makes a difference. If you would like to talk about this with someone, in confidence, then please consider speaking with the treasurer, <u>John Grierson</u> or the Vicar, <u>Sarah</u>.
