Suffolk Sheep

'I know my own and my own know me.' John 10.14


Sheep are not known for their intelligence. Sheep tend to wander. Sheep get lost easily. Sheep have little sense of direction. Sheep graze peacefully for hours, but when food and security is scarce they become restless and unsettled. A sheep is prized and precious, no different to any other sheep yet special to the shepherd. Sheep follow the voice of their own shepherd. When a sheep is 'cast down' it needs help to get up: a 'cast' sheep is a sorry sight, lying on it's back, feet in the air, frantically flaying, lashing out without success. Everything sticks to a sheep and they attract debris like velcro. Sheep must be sheared: not a terribly dignified or pleasant process - but necessary and liberating to be fleeced of the hot, heavy, tick-ridden, burden.

I wonder how clever you really are? I wonder where you are wandering - as individuals and as a church community. Are you lost or without direction? Or unsettled and restless? Whose voice are you listening to? Your own? God's voice? How do you know it is God speaking to you? How do you know you're not hearing what you want to hear rather than what God is trying to say to you? What are you flailing about? Whose help do you need? What is clinging to your velcro: any debris? Patterns of behaviour or thinking that fall short of Christ's hope for you or damage others around you? And when were you last shorn? If it was recently - have you got over the shock? Or has it set you free to gambol like a young lamb? Perhaps it is close to shearing time again?

> These are the kinds of wonderings I pray through regularly. As you pray, perhaps you might choose to join me.


Margaret Woodward is willing to serve a third successive year as churchwarden should she be elected.

City Fibre installing broadband into the church this week.

Thank you for the encouraging feedback that was received following last Sunday's services and continued thanks to Andy Turpin, Stuart Quinton and Steve Roberts for the time they've dedicated to the project. Members of the sound team are about to embark on their training too, so thanks again for all the time you commit to serving the community in this way.

The hearing loop has now been fully extended into the church so if you are a hearing aid user you should be able to sit anywhere in the church. Over the next few weeks it would be really helpful if you could sit somewhere different to

usual to help us to test the loop does work and please send us any feedback. The loop also goes into the Lady Chapel but due to the configuration of the cabling it might be disproportionately louder so please don't be surprised if this is the case and again, please send us any feedback.

Speakers have now been extended into the choir and we will continue to livestream: **this week using our new broadband link, rather than relying on the 4G network.** Please see the links at the top of the page to access the livestream.

Meanwhile, the two projectors in the side aisles are still awaiting lenses and we hope this will be completed in early May.

We are also very much looking forward to the Quinquennial works beginning in May.

Church Maintenance Stone & Masonry Repairs 13 May to 2 August 2024

Six years after our architect's last building inspection we are pleased to be carrying out much needed repairs to the stonework and masonry. Works to the tower are located close to memorials: contractors are aware to work with care in this area. Churchyard planting will see some changes: the laurel and bay growing against the tower will be removed to reduce damp in the base of the tower and some other planting temporarily removed. We expect to see scaffolding on the south and east of the church, the south and west faces of the tower.

We hope to keep the church open daily as usual between 10am and 4pm.

Prayerful action: how shall I help?

Through the parish giving scheme, as circumstances change you can easily amend the amount that you give. Is this something to consider today?

If you are a taxpayer, have you signed a Gift Aid declaration form enabling the church to turn your £1 into £1.25?

Occasional Giving: Make an occasional unexpected gift of grafitude, just because you can! It's easy to 'forget' that God is involved when money regularly goes straight from your account.

Gift in support of a particular project, a fundraising event, a significant life event or an area of church activity. Pledge a % of your estate by making a gift in your will.

Where does the money come from?

Parish churches receive no direct funding from the government or The Church of England.

St Margaret's relies upon the generous financial support of the congregation, all those who support the heritage of their local church and those from the wider community who value the work of the church.

It costs around £150,000 to resource St Margaret's each year; this is before anything is set aside for long-term

maintenance or a rainy day. In a parish of 3,600 households, just over 70 currently give regularly through tax-efficient planned giving, historically raising about 60% of annual income. The remainder has to come from church centre lettings and fundraising.

Budget projections

The PCC is working out what is needed in order to maintain the current levels of church activity and mission... estimated income for 2024 already looks lower than likely expenditure and that's before putting aside any savings for future repairs and maintenance.

Minor change major impact!


The annual impact soon adds up! If 90 people committed to give each week an extra:

£1 (the cost of a small chocolate bar) = £4,680 £2 (the cost of a takeaway coffee) = $\pm 9,360$ £4 (a packet of crisps & a pint of beer) = £18,720

f7.50 (the cost of a bottle of wine) = f35,100This may not be possible for everyone. But it will be for some. And if you're not yet giving regularly: making a habit of regular giving helps the church to focus its energy on mission, not money.



Financial Giving

The life and mission of St Margaret's is financially sustained through generous giving. If you have been giving regularly as part of your practice of gratefully living in God's service, thank you. If you're new to the community, or would like to think about celebrating life in this way, you may find the following helpful: we receive no income from 'The Church'... we are the church! So, thank you – for anything and everything that you are able to give in response to God's generosity.

Here are some answers to the practicalities of giving:

- **Collection plate** during services a collection plate is sometimes passed among the congregation, but you will more often find it at the South door as you leave or arrive.
- **Tap giving** during services a tap giving machine is located on the pillar on the west wall, to the left of the bell tower – do consider tapping your card or device. As well as giving regularly, this is also a good way of offering an occasional additional gift.
- **Regular Giving** St Margaret's is registered with the <u>Parish Giving</u> <u>Scheme</u>, allowing you to be in control of your giving and to give securely and safely online by Direct Debit.
- **Online giving** If you wish to make a one-off or extra gift online, you can do so securely via the <u>Parish Giving Scheme</u>.
- **Gift Aid** if you are a tax payer, St Margaret's can claim back the basic tax you have already paid to the government. To make the appropriate declarations, please speak with the treasurer, <u>John Grierson</u>.
- Leaving a **gift in your will** or making a **donation in memory** of a loved one – no matter how large or small, every gift makes a difference. If you would like to talk about this with someone, in confidence, then please consider speaking with the treasurer, <u>John Grierson</u> or the Vicar, <u>Sarah</u>.
