Sunday 27th Sept: O Father whose love has given freewill to every human soul, teach us in love to choose your will as ours, through Jesus Christ our Lord.

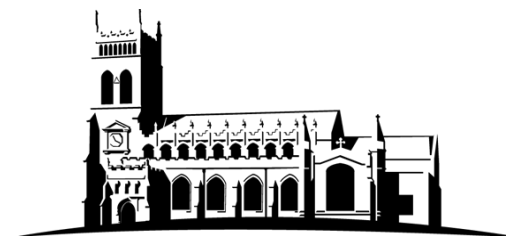
Monday 28th Sept: Let everything that has breath praise the Lord. Psalm 150 verse 6
