A Reflection from Rev Sarah

Rev Helen preached powerfully at Ash Wednesday's service of Holy Communion with the imposition of Ashes, reminding us that the purpose of the Lenten season is to make our preparations to meet with the risen Christ at Easter.

We will be exploring this in a number of ways: during our services in the coming weeks we will reflect again on how our baptism is the start of the journey through the wilderness of life, how fasting, prayer and almsgiving and tends to many forms of poverty as we connect with Kagera and the Bishop's Lent Appeal, whilst also wondering on Mothering Sunday about the mothering 'Church' in our lives. There will be conversations at Lent Lunches and an invitation to practice prayer in a variety of different ways in our Lent Groups.

There are our own personal preparations too - perhaps a book to read, a retreat or a pilgrimage walk, or a spring clean of 'the stuff of life' as we plan for that day when our Easter encounter will be with the risen Lord for all eternity.

As we travel through Lent, may we find blessing in the dust of Ash Wednesday and in the dustiness of the wilderness that can sometimes be our experience of this earthly life together.

Did you know?

DID YOU KNOW that the church has always been involved in supporting the poor of the parish? When Henry VIII confiscated the church's wealth in 1536 this support was interrupted. In 1572 the parish was instructed to raise taxes for the relief of "poore people".

Records for 1574 show that the parish collected 93d (old pence) from 36 people and distributed 107d (old pence) to 27 individuals.

Offertory

The life and mission of St Margaret's is financially sustained through generous giving. If you have been giving regularly as part of your practice of gratefully living in God's service, thank you. If you're new to the community, or would like to think about celebrating life in this way, you may find the following helpful: we receive no income from 'The Church'... we are the church! So, thank you – for anything and everything that you are able to give in response to God's generosity.

Here are some answers to the practicalities of giving:

- Collection plate during services a collection plate is sometimes passed among the congregation, but you will more often find it at the South door as you leave or arrive.
- Tap giving during services a tap giving machine is located on the pillar on the west wall, to the left of the bell tower do consider tapping your card or device. As well as giving regularly, this is also a good way of offering an occasional additional gift.
- **Regular Giving** St Margaret's is registered with the <u>Parish Giving Scheme</u>, allowing you to be in control of your giving and to give securely and safely online by Direct Debit.

- Online giving If you wish to make a one-off or extra gift online, you can do so securely via the <u>Parish Giving Scheme</u>.
- **Gift Aid** if you are a tax payer, St Margaret's can claim back the basic tax you have already paid to the government. To make the appropriate declarations, please speak with the treasurer, <u>John Grierson</u>.
- Leaving a **gift in your will** or making a **donation in memory** of a loved one no matter how large or small, every gift makes a difference. If you would like to talk about this with someone, in confidence, then please consider speaking with the treasurer, <u>John Grierson</u> or the Vicar, <u>Sarah</u>.
