The Lord's Prayer

The risen Christ is ascended and so we wait for the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. I'm looking forward to Pentecost - it's a great celebration of the Holy Spirit of God, though I've come to see the festival as the beginning of the church, rather than the arrival of the Holy Spirit. For the Holy Spirit has been with us since the beginning of time. As God's church, we live 'in between' times; we find ourselves between Ascension Pentecost and praying for God's realm and the coming of the Kingdom which we inhabit and hope for, yet know we are also journeying towards - both in the fulness of the heavenly kingdom and the experience of eternity ahead, but also in earth, today, as we campaign for the basics in human life for so many who are starving or being starved by war or politics or economics. No food. No water. No safety.

And so we keep on praying the words of the Lord's prayer, 'Thy Kingdom Come'.

The Church of England has resources during these nine days between Ascension and Pentecost that you might like to use (the link is below in the 'Church News' section).

'The Message' translation of Matthew's gospel teaches the Lord's prayer in this way:

"The world is full of so-called prayer warriors who are prayer-ignorant. They're full of formulas and programs and advice, peddling techniques for getting what you want from God. Don't fall for that nonsense. This is your Father you are dealing with, and he knows better than you what you need. With a God like this loving you, you can pray very simply. Like this:

Our Father in heaven,

Reveal who you are.

Set the world right;

Do what's best-

as above, so below.

Keep us alive with three square meals.

Keep us forgiven with you and forgiving others.

Keep us safe from ourselves and the Devil.

You're in charge!

You can do anything you want!

You're ablaze in beauty!

Yes. Yes. Yes.

Dare you pray 'Lord, your kingdom come'?

Although we had a pigeon flying around the church a few weeks ago we also have a medieval carving of a bird in one of the window spandrels. We think it is the first time it has been seen for many years.

It is next to the Trademark of Mr Bryd or Byrde the thatcher.

It can be found in the right hand spandrel above the fourth clerestory window on the northside counting from the east end of the nave.

If you're new to the community, or would like to think about celebrating life in this way, you may find the following helpful: we receive no income from 'The Church'... we are the church! So, thank you – for anything and everything that you are able to give in response to God's generosity.

In church you can give in a couple of ways on the day:

Collection plate

 during services a collection plate is sometimes passed among the congregation, but you will more often find it at the South door as you leave or arrive. Do use a yellow envelope if you're a tax payer so gift aid may be re-claimed.

Tap giving

- during services a tap giving machine is located on the pillar on the west wall, to the left of the bell tower do consider tapping your card or device. As well as giving regularly, this is also a good way of offering an occasional additional gift.
- Regular Giving—St Margaret's is registered with the <u>Parish Giving Scheme</u>, allowing you to be in control of your giving and to give securely and safely online by Direct Debit.
- Online giving

 If you wish to make a one-off or extra gift online, you can do so securely via the

 Parish Giving Scheme.

Gift Aid

- if you are a tax payer, St Margaret's can claim back the basic tax you have already paid to the government. To make the appropriate declarations, please speak with the treasurer, John Grierson.
- Leaving agift in your willor making adonation in memory
 of a loved one no matter how large or small, every gift makes a difference. If you would like to talk about
